OSHKOSH '88

More than 825,000 people and 15,000 airplanes (including a record 2,053 showplanes) visited Wittman Field. The field was closed to transient aircraft on Opening Day at 9:00 A.M.! The FAA tower recorded 61,757 aircraft movements over the eight-day event. And you thought Buchanan was busy.

SWAMP GHOST UPDATE

The Travis AFB Museum has initiated a project to retrieve a Boeing B-17E, the "Swamp Ghost," which has been lying in the swamps of Papua New Guinea since the early days of 1942.

The "Swamp Ghost," piloted by Lt. Fred C. Eaton Jr., was one of six B-17's that participated in the first bombing raid of Rabaul Harbor in New Britain, a Japanese stronghold off the north coast of New Guinea. When the first planes arrived over he target, Rabual was hidden by clouds and volcanic smoke and steam. The planes circled overhead for 25 minutes before an opening appeared and they were able to drop their bombs on the ships in the harbor and head home.

But the bombs in Eaton's plane hung up in the rack and he had to make a second pass to release them. Meanwhile, the Japanese were alerted, and an anti-aircraft shell pierced her right wing. Then as many as 8 Japanese Zeroes attacked the lone bomber and after a 40 minute battle in the air the B-17 was peppered with holes. She had also knocked at least two of the Zeroes out of the sky.

Eaton headed for Port
Moresby where he could refuel but a
few hours later it was clear he
wasn't going to make it over the
Owen Stanley Mountains. So he
landed his plane in the Agaimbo
Swamp where it has remained for 45
years. All of the crew members
survived the landing and the 6-week
ordeal which followed as they made
their way through the swamp, out to
the coast and round the eastern end
of New Guinea to Port Moresby.
Many of them are alive to this day.

Even though her participation in the war was cut short, the "Swamp Ghost" will play an important role in decades to come. The Travis AFB Museum plans to return the "Swamp Ghost" to the Travis AFB where she will be restored by the members of the Tavis AFB Historical

Society, and put on display at the Museum. She is the oldest intact Boeing-built B-17 in the world, the only one with remote bottom turret, the only B-17 still in its original combat configuration, and the only WWII airplane that can be restored to show its original combat damage.
